

Independent providers will submit claims differently to be paid overtime for the Individual Options and Level One waivers. Independent providers will need to use the following procedure codes for overtime claims.

For Homemaker/Personal Care

APV when providing services under the Individual Options Waiver

FPV when providing routine services under the Level One Waiver

EPV when providing emergency services under the Level One Waiver

For On-site On-call

AOV when providing services under the Individual Options Waiver

FOV when providing routine services under the Level One Waiver

EOV when providing emergency services under the Level One Waiver

Independent providers must use the appropriate code that relates to the service delivered at the time they exceed 40 hours in a workweek. **A workweek is defined as beginning Sunday at 12 AM and ending Saturday at 11:59 PM.**

If a provider forgets to use the overtime code and submits a claim with the regular code, the provider will be reimbursed at the regular, non-overtime rate.

All independent providers serving people in group settings under the Individual Options and Level One Waivers will be required to indicate the appropriate group size.

When delivering more than 40 hours of service, independent providers must submit the appropriate overtime code along with the group size to be reimbursed at the overtime rate.

Time spent delivering services under the waiver programs administered by DODD, ODM, ODA, and private duty nursing is the only time that is counted towards overtime.

Example:

Sunday through Wednesday an independent provider delivers 32 hours [8 hours per day] of HPC to an individual on an I/O waiver. Thursday the same provider delivers 12 hours of HPC to another individual on a LV1 waiver. Billing would look like this:
